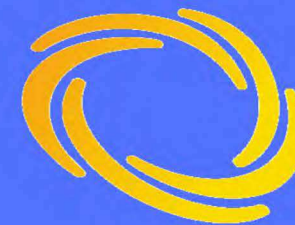

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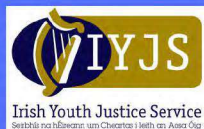

## Who we Are

Donycarney Youth Justice Project (DYJP) is part of the wider organisation that is Donnycarney Youth Project (DYP) . The Youth justice Workers (Daniel & Emma) are funded by the Irish Youth Justice Service. We are one of many Garda Youth Diversion Projects across the City.

Our Primary concern is to support and address the needs of young people who have been referred to us by the local Juvenile Liaison Officer (JLO) for Donnycarney, Fairview, Clontarf and surrounding areas.

A referral can also come from an agency or family member who has a concern for the young person.

The young person's attendance to DYJP is based on their voluntary participation.

## Understanding needs

Every young person has needs, which we aim yo fulfil through a variety of channels such as relationships, social interactions, sports education, etc.

If a young person's needs are not being met, they often seek out alternative channels that are easily accessible to them. This can result in the young person getting involved in anti-social or illegal activities in an effort to satisfy their needs.



The Project is Funded by the department of Justice Equality and Law Reform and the European Social Fund and is free to Young People.



## How we work

Daniel and Emma develop positive relationships with young people to get to understand their individual needs and strengths.

In partnership with the young people we create interventions through programmes and activities specifically to address those needs, thus creating an environment where a young person can make informed decisions leading to positive lifestyle choices.
